# Preventive Immunizations

# Immunization Administration

## ***Preventive when included as part of a preventive immunization***

- **90460** - Immunization administration **through 18 years of age** via any route of administration, with counseling by physician or other qualified health care professional; first or only component of each vaccine or toxoid administered.
- **90461** - Immunization administration **through 18 years of age** via any route of administration, with counseling by physician or other qualified health care professional; each additional vaccine or toxoid component administered (List separately in addition to code for primary procedure).
- **90471** - Immunization administration (includes percutaneous, intradermal, subcutaneous, or intramuscular injections); one vaccine (single or combination vaccine/toxoid).
- **90472** - Immunization administration (includes percutaneous, intradermal, subcutaneous, or intramuscular injections); each additional vaccine (single or combination vaccine/toxoid) (List separately in addition to code for primary procedure).
- **90473** - Immunization administration by intranasal or oral route; one vaccine (single or combination vaccine/toxoid).
- **90474** - Immunization administration by intranasal or oral route; each additional vaccine (single or combination vaccine/toxoid) (List separately in addition to code for primary procedure).
- **G0008** – Administration of influenza virus vaccine.
- **G0009** – Administration of pneumococcal vaccine.

# Vaccine Codes

- **Influenza** – 90662, 90685, 90686
- **Pneumococcal Conjugate (PVC13)** – 90670
- **Pneumococcal Polysaccharide (PPSV23)** – 90732
- **Tetanus, diphtheria toxoids and acellular pertussis (Tdap)** – 90715
- **Tetanus and diphtheria (Td)** – 90714
- **Meningococcal Serogroup B (MenB-4C and MenB-FHbp)** – 90620-90621
- **Meningococcal Conjugate (MCV4)** - 90734



# Billing and Coding

## **Member Cost Share:**

Non-State supplied immunization coverage is member benefit driven and could be subject to the member copayment/coinsurance.

## **Claim Form:**

Providers should use the claim form that is applicable per their contract.

## **Administration:**

Providers should bill an administrative code for all immunizations – *both State-supplied and non-State supplied.*

## **Vaccine:**

All vaccines administered should be billed with the appropriate codes, and if a State-supplied vaccine, the billed amount should be \$0.50. Refer to the Preventive Care Services Policy and Coding Guidelines Summary.

## Vaccines for Children/Recent Changes in RI

- The Vaccines for Children (VFC) program was established in 1993 to serve children defined as "federally vaccine eligible" under section 1928(b)(2), which includes both "uninsured" and "Medicaid eligible" children.
  - All children from birth through 18 years of age (18 years + 364 days) who are covered by Medicaid are considered VFC eligible because of their Medicaid status.
  - Immunization programs that receive VFC funds are required to implement ACIP-recommended vaccines for which there are VFC resolutions and for which federal contracts have been established to purchase these vaccines.
  - Please refer to the UnitedHealthcare's Community & State 'Vaccines for Children' policy for a list of immunizations covered under the VFC program.
  - While Influenza vaccine is part of the VFC program, the influenza vaccine ("flu shot") is generally ordered separately from other VFC vaccines. Flu vaccine is ordered on a different schedule as it is not a vaccine supplied year round. Many states have Influenza vaccination programs in addition to VFC program.
- With Recent RI Legislative changes for Adults in our Medicaid products, as well as for children and adults in our Commercial products, providers will be getting their vaccines through the State Supplied Vaccine program. For these members, providers who get the vaccines supplied by the State will need to bill for the actual vaccines at \$0.50 per vaccine, in addition to billing for the vaccine administration code, and these would be separate from any billed office visit procedure code. We anticipate sending out communication on this to providers in the near future.

# Retail Program

## ***National Vaccine Program***

UnitedHealthcare's National Vaccine Program includes national retail and pharmacy locations that can provide a select group of vaccines to our members under their preventative medical benefit.

## ***Contracted Vendors***

The below national retail locations and pharmacies have entered into agreements with UnitedHealthcare. The agreement allows these vendors to bill UnitedHealthcare directly for administering vaccines. Benefits will be processed under the member's preventative medical plan benefit versus the member's pharmacy benefit. The contracted vendors will submit individual claims for each member; they do not submit roster bills or invoices to UHC.
